Did you know...?


- ...'disability' includes mental health conditions as well as physical conditions.

- ...'ethnic group' includes race, colour, nationality and/or ethnic origins.
- ...'religion' doesn't just include faith but also includes philosophical, spiritual beliefs or no beliefs at all.

Some of the questions might seem strange. The Equality Act 2010 tells us the areas of your life where it is particularly important that we treat you fairly. These are the areas we ask you questions about. Below are the characteristics that are protected under The Equality Act.



Your information is safe. We won't pass on information that you give us using the monitoring form unless we have your permission to do so. The law tells us we must protect any personal information you give us.

Your information is very helpful. The information gives us a picture of who is using our services and who is, or is not, contacting us. This helps us improve the way we communicate and we can adapt the way we do things to meet your needs.
