## Situation:

There is a currently national shortage of liquid antibiotics (phenoxymethylpenicillin, amoxicillin, macrolide)

- Supplies of tablets are currently available
- TTA packs have been affected across all preparations
- Central procurement systems are working closely with pharmacy wholesalers and hospitals

## Action

- Do not issue phenoxymethylpenicillin, amoxicillin or macrolide liquids to children >1years at present nor write a FP10 for liquids for children >1 as these need to be reserved. (Except in exceptional circumstances, learning difficulties, tube fed).
- Follow the below guidance on preparation supplied
- Out of pharmacy working hours if there are no suitable TTA packs available:
  - Give a single dose from ward stock of the first choice BD regimen and give FP10 or outpatient prescription for further supplies

Issuing macrolides to penicillin allergic children

(Dosing suggestions for group A strep) see guidelines and BNFc for dosing specific to indication for other indications **Local macrolide resistance 9.5%. Send throat swab when issuing macrolide.**

## Duration

- 5days for simple sore throat (\*3days if using azithromycin)

- 10days if scarlet fever signs/suspicion (\*5days if using azithromycin)
