Greek, Latin and Olde English



- Dia-gnosis (G)— a resolving, deciding
- Pro-gnosis a foreknowledge
- Therapon an attendant
- Therapeuo to attend, including the Gods. Fourth meaning
 - to attend and heal the sick
- Pre-scribere to set out in writing (scribere to write)
- Re-cipere (L) to take
- Recipe 'take this' R_x
- Health hale heal-th (haelan OE) soundness of body,
 (good) condition of body. Heal to restore to health, to cure



Greek, Roman and Olde English



- No modern medicines
- Some specific herbs
- Get the environment right (eg sanatoria- sana health)
- Strengthen the Person (nutrition, exercises etc)
- Address the wound / illness
- Some 'dodgy' practices and some that seemed to work

- Nutrition / diet
- Surgery
- Physio-therapy
- Biblio-therapy
- Psycho-therapy
- Nature-based therapy
- Social interventions
- Medicines

- Right diagnosis
- Lifestyle and other advice to strengthen the person (??including trace elements, nutrition etc)
- Right medicine
- Right time
- Right duration

- Deprescribing
- Non-medical prescribers
