REPORT TO COMMITTEE / BOARD

In November 2023 - March 2024 and ICB Governance reviewed was completed by BDO. Following this review, the Governance Handbook has been revised to take account of the amendments to the various ICB Governance documents.

The governance handbook sets out NHS Somerset Integrated Care Board's (ICB) key governance arrangements. It is comprised of the following:

- Constitution (incorporating the Standing Orders) (to be approved by NHS England)
- Terms of Reference for the Committees of the ICB Board
- Scheme of Reservation and Delegation and Standing Financial Instructions

- Standards of Business Conduct and Managing Conflicts of Interest Policy
- Integrated Care Boards Establishment Order 2022

The following summary report outlines the contents of the handbook with the full documentation provided as a **Technical Appendix** to the Board of Directors' papers:

GOVERNANCE HANDBOOK

Constitution (requires NHS England approval)

The NHS Somerset Constitution has been updated to reflect the updated guidance published by NHS England in July 2024.

Amendments include:

- General formatting and grammar updates
- Removal of sections required for initial ICB establishment
- Includes an option to increase the number of Non-Executive Members from four to five
- Includes the option for an Associate Non-Executive Member
- Other minor amendments

The Board are asked to **endorse** the submission of the Constitution to NHS England for approval.

Terms of Reference for ICB Committees

The Terms of Reference for the ICB Committees have been standardised and updated to reflect their current roles and responsibilities. Amendments include:

- Membership and attendee lists have been updated to reflect the new structures.
- All committees will be required to circulate papers, where possible, five working days in advance of meetings, rather than five calendar days.

The Terms of Reference have been reviewed by the respective Committees/leads who have endorsed the submission of the Terms of Reference to the Board for approval.

The Board are asked to **approve** the updated Terms of Reference.

Standing Financial Instructions

The ICB updates its SFIs on a regular basis and were reviewed by the Audit Committee in September 2024. The key changes to the revised SFIs are as follows:

- Section 5.6 a new section has been added to reflect the ICBs use of credit cards
- Section 5.10 the SFIs now include an explicit statement that debtor balances of £5 or below will automatically be written off in line with NHS England Best Practice
- Section 7 now includes sections on the ICBs Triple Lock Policy and the Health Care Services
- (Provider Selection Regime) Regulations 2023

- Section 8 updated terminology reflecting the Chief People Officer role
- Section 8 Changes to the Prepayments section to align with 'managing public money' guidance
- Appendices various updates to reflect the Provider Selection Regime and Triple Lock Policy

The Board are asked to **approve** the updated Standing Financial Instructions.

Governance Handbook

1. Purpose of the Governance Handbook

The governance handbook sets out NHS Somerset Integrated Care Board's (ICB) key governance arrangements. It is comprised of the following:

- Constitution (incorporating the Standing Orders) (to be approved by NHS England)
- Terms of the Reference for the Committees of the ICB Board and structure chart
- Scheme of Reservation and Delegation and Standing Financial Instructions
- Standards of Business Conduct and Managing Conflicts of Interest Policy
- Integrated Care Boards Establishment Order 2022

Other supporting documents include the ICB's Operating Model and the composition and roles and responsibilities of the members of the ICB Board.

2. The Role of the ICB and ICS

ICBs are statutory organisations (established 1 July 2022) that bring the NHS together locally to improve population health and deliver shared strategic priorities, connecting to partnerships across the wider Integrated Care System (ICS). NHS Somerset is responsible for commissioning health and care services for our 580,000 residents. We play a pivotal role in allocating resource, ensuring delivery and driving improvement. We can only do this by bringing organisations together to work as one integrated care system (ICS) for Somerset. By working with our local communities, voluntary and partner organisations, we will transform how we work, strengthening our collaborations with the joint goal to improve the health and wellbeing of those people that live in our fantastic county.

3. ICB Board and Committee Member Roles The Board

The Board has the overall function and duty of establishing and maintaining the strategic direction of the ICB. It agrees the vision, strategy and policy, and agrees a forward plan with clear objectives to deliver the organisation's purpose. It is accountable for governing the organisation and holds the executive and its members to account for the delivery of strategy. It must be risk-aware and receive assurance about progress against aims and targets both for the ICB and the system.

Composition of the Board

In accordance with paragraph 3 of Schedule 1B to the 2006 Act, the membership of the Board of the ICB consists of:

- a) Chair
- b) Chief Executive
- c) 1 Partner Member NHS and Foundation Trusts
- d) 1 Partner Member Primary Medical Services
- e) 1 Partner Member Local Authorities
- f) Up to 5 Non-Executive Members (one of which, but not the Audit Committee Chair, will be appointed Deputy Chair, and one of which, who may be the Deputy Chair or the Audit Committee Chair, will be appointed the Senior Non-Executive Member)
- g) Director of Finance (known as Chief Finance Officer)
- h) Medical Director (known as Chief Medical Officer)
- i) Director of Nursing (known as Chief Nursing Officer)
- j) Public Health Expert

These are the roles that would be considered 'voting members' of the Board.

Regular Participants and Observers at Board Meetings

The Board may invite specified individuals to be Participants or Observers at its meetings in order to inform its decision-making and the discharge of its functions as it sees fit.

Participants will receive advanced copies of the notice, agenda and papers for Board meetings. They may be invited to attend any or all of the Board meetings, or part(s) of a meeting by the Chair. Any such person may be invited, at the discretion of the Chair to ask questions and address the meeting but may <u>not vote</u>. The following participants can be invited to attend each Board Meeting:

- a) Additional ICB Executive Directors
- b) Healthwatch
- c) Voluntary, Community, Faith and Social Enterprise (VCFSE) sector
- d) Associate Non-Executive Member

The nomination and selection process for Board members is outlined in section 3 of the NHS Somerset constitution.

4. Committee Arrangements, Governance and Terms of Reference

The governance of the Somerset ICB Board is underpinned by the following committees chaired by a Non-Executive Member:

- ICB Audit Committee
- ICB Finance Committee
- ICB Quality Committee
- ICB Primary Care Commissioning Committee
- ICB Remuneration Committee

In addition, there is an executive led ICB Management Board.

These organisational arrangements are supported by collaborative, system working arrangements and groups, which feed-up through the System Collaboration Forum, and report via the chief executives into respective boards. The Board of the Somerset ICB receives a report from the Collaboration Forum at its meetings to ensure visibility of system working arrangements.

The Terms of Reference for the Board Committees of the ICB set out the purpose, membership and responsibilities delegated to each Committee and form part of the handbook.

5. Functions of the ICB, Scheme of Reservation and Delegation and Standing Financial Instructions

ICBs are statutory bodies and as such their powers, functions and duties are conferred, in the main, by legislation. Additional responsibilities for other functions may be conferred through delegation to the ICB from other bodies (such as NHS England).

The ICB must act in a way that is consistent with its statutory functions, both powers and duties. Many of these statutory functions are set out in the 2006 Act but there are also other specific pieces of legislation that apply to ICBs. Examples include, but are not limited to, the Equality Act 2010 and the Children Acts. Some of the statutory functions that apply to ICBs take the form of general statutory duties, which the ICB must comply with when exercising its functions. These duties include but are not limited to:

- a) having regard to and acting in a way that promotes the NHS Constitution (section 2 of the Health Act 2009 and section 14Z32 of the 2006 Act);
- b) exercising its functions effectively, efficiently and economically (section 14Z33 of the 2006 Act);
- c) duties in relation to children including safeguarding, promoting welfare etc (including the Children Acts 1989 and 2004, and the Children and Families Act 2014)
- d) adult safeguarding and carers (the Care Act 2014)
- e) equality, including the public-sector equality duty (under the Equality Act 2010) and the duty as to health inequalities (section 14Z35)
- f) information law, (for instance, data protection laws, such as the UK General Data Protection Regulation 2016/679 and Data Protection Act 2018, and the Freedom of Information Act 2000); and
- g) provisions of the Civil Contingencies Act 2004.

The Scheme of Reservation and Delegation (SoRD) sets out those decisions that are reserved to the ICB Board and those decisions that have been delegated to ICB committees, individuals, joint committees and other statutory organisations.

The Standing Financial Instructions (SFIs) ensure that the ICB fulfils its statutory duty to carry out its functions effectively, efficiently and economically. The SFIs are part of the ICB's control environment for managing the organisation's financial affairs as they are designed to ensure regularity and propriety of financial transactions.

6. Standards of Business Conduct and Managing Conflicts of Interest

Public service values must be at the heart of the NHS. High standards of corporate and personal conduct, based on a recognition that patients come first, have been a requirement throughout the NHS since its inception. Because the NHS is publicly funded, it must be accountable for its services and for the effective and economical use of taxpayers' money.

NHS Somerset's Standards of Business Conduct and Managing Conflicts of Interest policy reflects the arrangements as set out in section 6 of the Constitution, and complies with relevant legislation and guidance. It sets out NHS Somerset will manage conflicts of interests arising from the operation of its business, and how staff should manage offers of gifts and hospitality.
