2 NEW ISSUES AND/OR NEW RISKS IDENTIFIED

This was the first time the SCC received a risk register and the risks below are ones newly added since the final PCCC on 04 June 2025.

- 749 Risk of significant business impacts on ICB as result of transition to cluster (rated 20)
 - 729 Risk of being unable to maintain the GP speciality training pipeline – (rated 15)
 - 734 Risk that closure of the CSU will lead to loss of IT staff impacting GP IT service delivery (rated 12)
 - 733 Risk that network equipment will no longer be supported in this year and replacement is required (rated 9)
 - 743 Risk that prescription paper is not secure in GP practices (rated 9)
 - 732 Risk that GP colleagues with NHS.net local helpdesk permissions may not adhere to local and organisation processes (rated 8)
 - 730 Risk that lack of funding beyond March 2026 will end Training Hub support, impacting the Somerset GP workforce (rated 6)
 - 735 Risk that organisational change from clustering will lead to staff disengagement and reduced performance (rated 4)
